Who was Hans Christian Andersen?

He was a Danish author.

He wrote plays, poetry and books for adults but is most famous for his fairy tales. Many of these, such as 'The Little Mermaid', are still very well-known

today.





There is a statue of the Little Mermaid in Copenhagen the capital city of Denmark. To this day, the Little Mermaid is the most famous tourist attraction in Denmark. It is also one of **the most photographed statues in the world**.

What was his life like?

Growing up, he had no brothers and sisters and was very poor.

He went to school but also had to work to support himself and his mother.

He moved from his hometown Odense in Denmark to become an actor.

It was here he decided to write.

He travelled around Europe and was inspired to write about the places he visited and the local tales.

When he was in England, he met with the famous writer, Charles Dickens. They both told stories involving the poor, showing how it was unfair and so they became friends.

Hans Christian Andersen never married.

Because of all his wonderful stories, he was loved by the people of Denmark.

When he died, in 1875, a large statue was made to remember him and his stories.

Since then, there have been movies made about his stories.


Art Have fun with scissors







Hans Christian Anderson's impact to the fairy tale world has been enormous, and lots of his books have been made into movies.


