read, create a quiz for a member of your family / your teacher to answer.

Try to use a range of different questions in your quiz, such as:

- True/False
- Multiple choice
- Ordering statements

You may choose to create your quiz on an online platform such as Kahoot! https://kahoot.com/home/family-friends/

- Have you included any personal accounts about life as an evacuee (this could be taken from the BBC video clip you have watched)?

Remember to proof-read your information page, checking for spelling and punctuation.

3. <u>Arriving in the</u> <u>countryside</u>

You may wish to end your short story describing what your character's new home is like. How are they settling in? Do they like the household they have been taken to?
