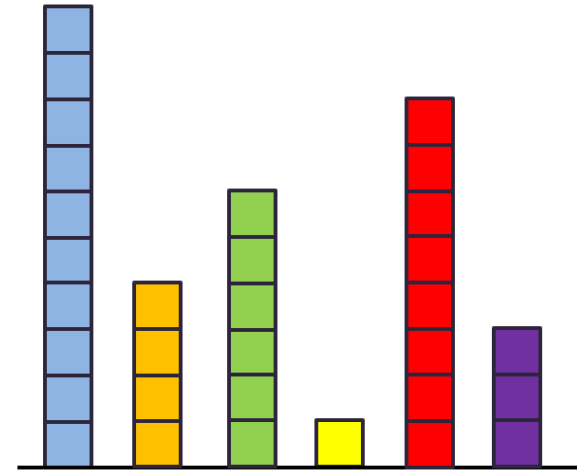


Tom's class collected information about their pets.
