Dear Parents and Carers,

This is our first newsletter for this new year and I would like to say well done and thank you.

I am really proud of all the children, families and staff for your support when we changed to remote learning on the day before term started. With the news we all received on Monday night, it turned out to be the correct decision. You are all doing a brilliant job with the remote learning and as parents and carers I understand the difficulties in balancing this with home and work life. Make sure you give everyone a break from time to time and always remember what a great job you are doing.

If you have any problems, any queries or need any support at home, please contact school so we can help you in any way possible. Even if it is not school related, we may have the answer or know where you can get support.

To support your children more with their reading we are setting up reading books remotely which match the books we have in school. Your class teacher will be in touch with logon details for you. In addition, it is important that you keep in touch with your child's class teacher by sending in work. We are making regular contact with all our families to check on your well being, to offer support on remote learning and to see if there is anything else we can help with. Children are receiving feedback for completed work they send in to school. You will see in the newsletter some examples of completed work both at home and in school. Well done to everyone.

If you haven't had a phone call from school, we may be struggling to get in touch with you. Please ensure you update your contact details with the school office if your phone number or other contact details change.

We are constantly updating the way we work in line with the changing circumstances during this pandemic. The staff team at school understand that keeping school arrangements constant is important for everyone in our community and we try to give as much notice as possible of any changes that need to be made. But the best way we can help everyone around us is to support remote learning so we are minimising contacts and so reducing the possibility of the virus being passed on.

Please review the information available in the newsletter and in particular please take note that we have a vacancy in school for a Parent Governor. The Governors oversee the running of the school and make decisions about how the school can improve. The Governing Body is very important in leading and supporting our school and working to ensure the best outcomes possible for our whole school community and in particular the children in school. 
