spending break and lunchtimes in the area.

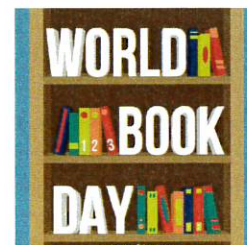

We will be celebrating World Book Day on Friday 4th March. Children are invited to dress up as their favourite character that day (non school uniform day for everyone that day).

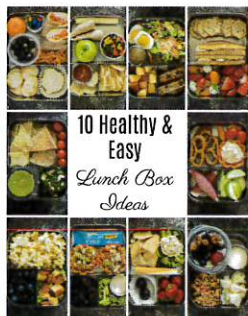

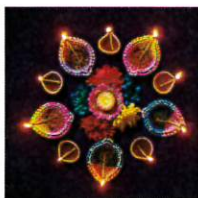


## Y4 Assembly
